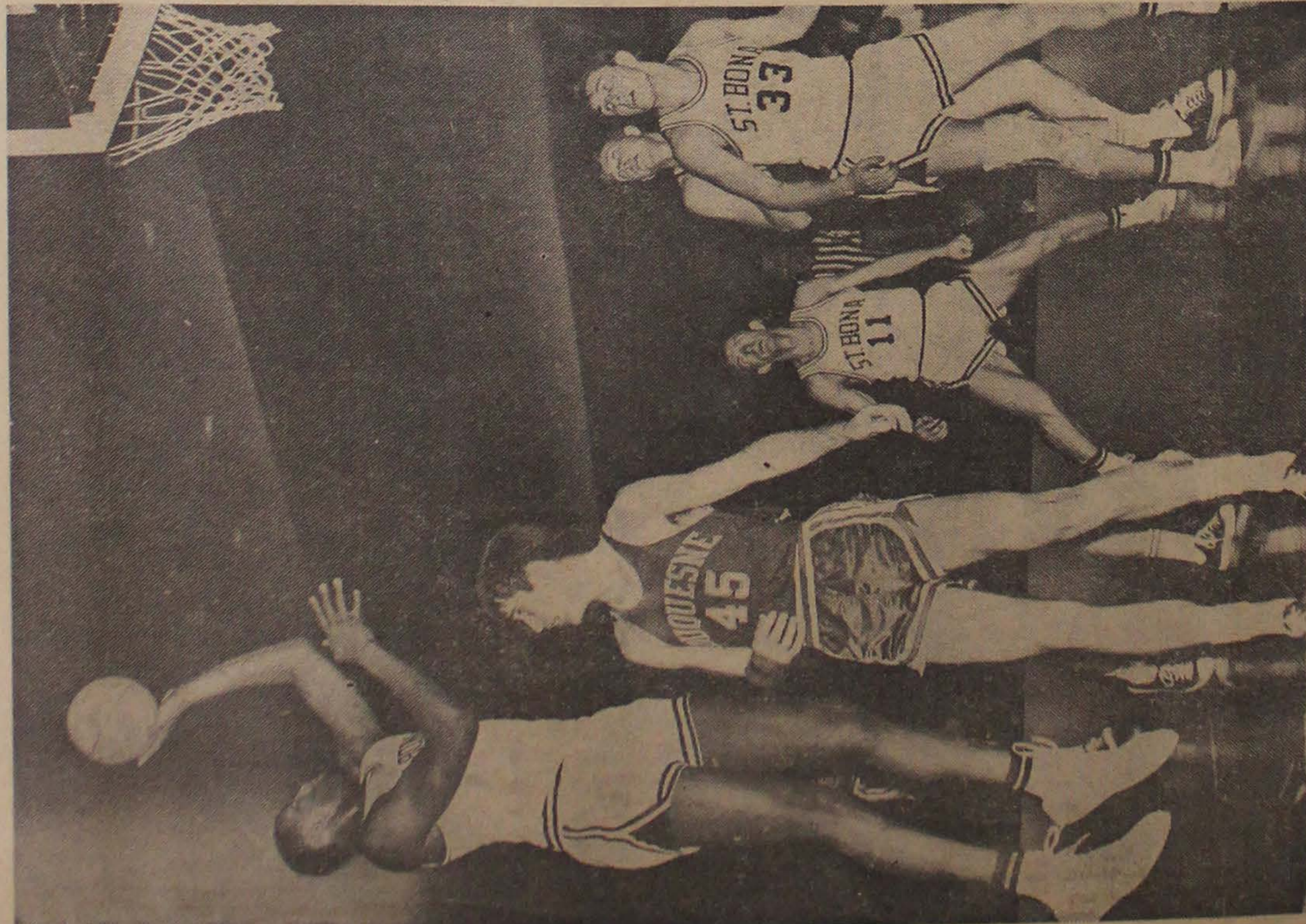
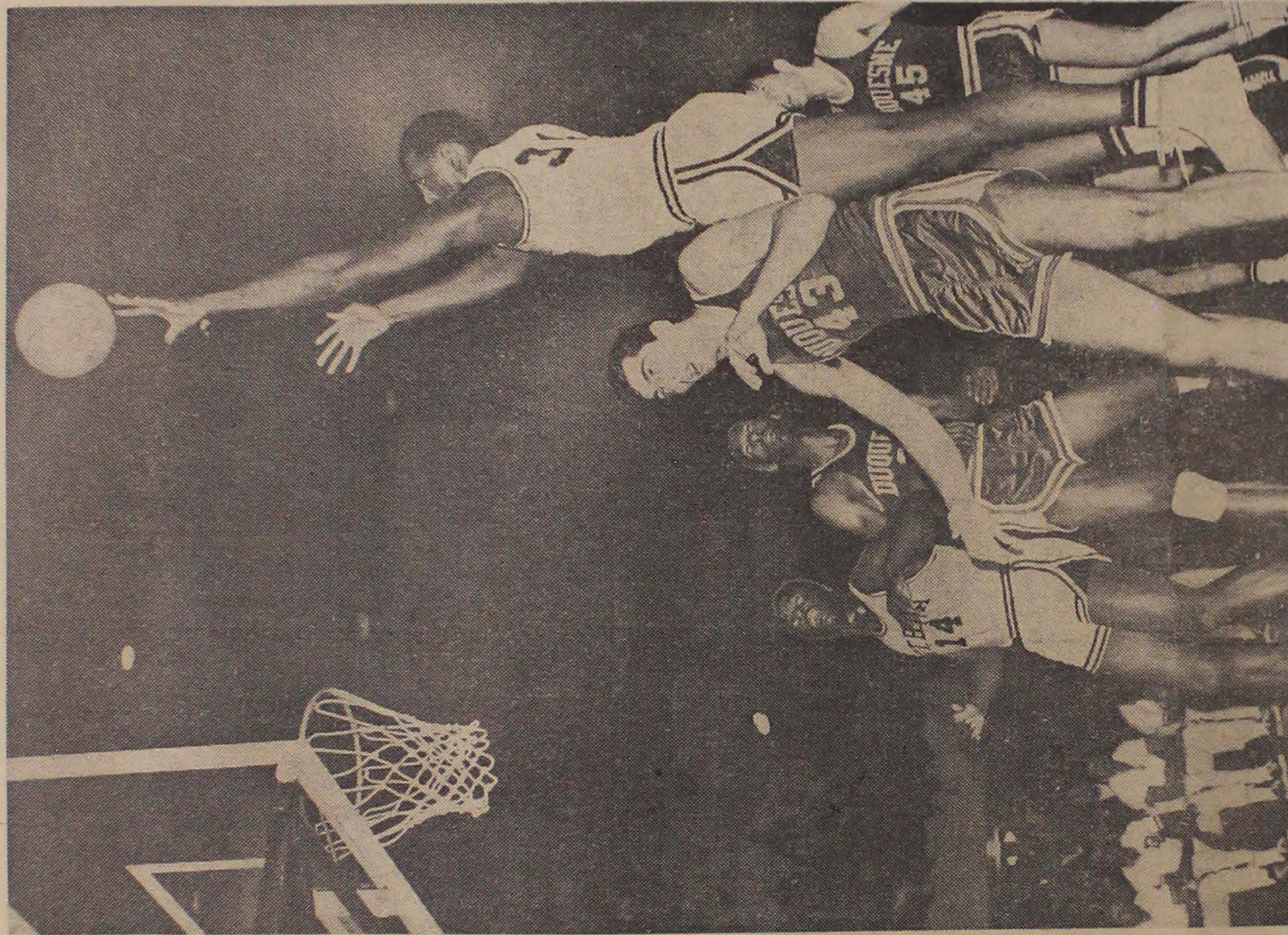


Lanier Stars as Bona Clips Duquesne

Giant Sophomore Meshes 39 Points In 96-74 Victory

Bob Lanier burst into Memorial Auditorium like a tornado Saturday night as St. Bonaventure's unbeaten basketball forces blasted Duquesne, 96-74.

The giant sophomore from Bennett High School, who estimates his height as 6-10½, made 39 points in his first varsity appearance in the downtown hall.

Showing an amazing left-handed touch around the basket, he sank 18 of 22 shots from the field, including an all-but-incredible string of 14 straight.

On Bench Four Minutes

All that halted his assault on the Aud record of 46 points held by Tom Smith and Willie Somerset was a stretch of approximately four minutes on the bench with four fouls.

His colleague in getting the points was another sophomore, Billy Kalbaugh, who set him up time and again with needle-threading passes for eight assists.

John Hayes had 27 points for the Bonnies and Jim Satalin netted 10.

The winners, now 5-0, shot 60.3 per cent from the floor, 41 of 68.

Guziak Paces Dukes

The Dukes, 4-1, were led by Ron Guziak, 25; Moe Barr, 15; and Phil Washington and Bill Zopf, 12 each.

Duquesne opened with a zone, Lanier 37.

Welse Clears Bench

Larry Welse, the Bona coach, cleared the bench in the final minute, earning a well-deserved ovation for a slick-working team.

The Bonnies stayed in Buffalo overnight and will leave for the Tampa tournament this morning. Their opening opponent Monday night is Auburn, and it seems that the Plainsmen have a large order.

Bona Ranked 12th Over A 10-Year Span

TAMPA — St. Bona as well as two other teams in the Tampa Invitational Basketball Tournament are in the top 15 of college basketball teams with best records in last 10 years.

The Bonnies are ranked 12th with 173-68 record, Seattle is 13th and Auburn (tonight's Bona foe) is listed 15th.

UCLA, national champion three of the last four years, is the leading team for the last five years on a won-lost basis. For the last 10 years, however, Cincinnati is No. 1.

UCLA, with a current winning streak of 37 in a row, have won 129 games and lost only 19 for a percentage of .872 for the last five years, including three games this season through Dec. 13.

Cincinnati, who won the national title in 1961 and 1962 and had a 37-game winning streak snapped in 1963, compiled a 230-53 .813 record for the 10-year span. The National Collegiate Sports Services compiled the figures.

Duke is second on the five-year list, followed by Texas at El Paso, Providence, Vanderbilt, Princeton, Davidson, St. Joseph's of Philadelphia, Chicago Loyola and San Francisco.

Rounding out the first 10 behind Cincinnati on the 10-year list are Providence, Bradley, Duke, St. Joseph's, West Virginia, UCLA, Kentucky, Dayton and Princeton and Kansas State tied for 10th.
