## Houston, Bonnies In Top Tests

## Cougars Face Chicago Loyola

Top-ranked Houston and third-ranked St. Bonaventure carried the nation's only perfect college basketball records into the first round of the National Collegiate tournament Saturday night.

Seven games at four scattered sites get the championship off the ground with most of the interest centered at Salt Lake City, Utah, were All-Amreican Elvin Hayes and his Houston mates shoot for their 30th straight victory - 29 this season - against Loyola of Chicago and at Kingston, R.I., where St. Bonaventure, 22-0, plays Boston College.
