Founder of Chipas Media Project Alexandra Halkin to Speak at SBU

Alexandra Halkin, founder of the Chiapas Media Project, will give a free public lecture at St. Bonaventure University at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 3, in the Dresser Auditorium of The John. J. Murphy Professional Building.

Halkin, video producer and founding director and international coordinator of the project, has been producing documentaries for the last 20 years. Halkin initiated funding and workshops for the project and the Chiapas Media Project was born.

The project is an award-winning bi-national partnership that provides video equipment, computers and training that enables marginalized indigenous communities in Southern Mexico to create their own media, and, since 1998, has distributed more than 4,000 indigenous produced videos.

Since 1998, the organization's instructors have worked closely with autonomous Zapatista communities. Indigenous youth with little formal education and often working without reliable electricity have produced videos on agricultural collectives, fair trade organic coffee, autonomous education, traditional healing and the history of their struggle for land.

Halkin's visit is sponsored by St. Bonaventure University's Diversity Action Committee and Clare College.
