served. A cash bar with legal beverages will also be available.

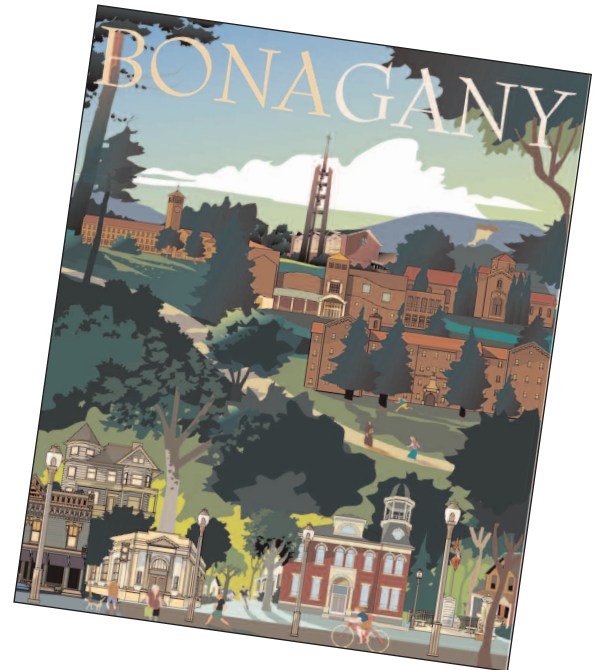
