I. It has become necessary to call the attention of the officers of this Command to the Orders of the War Department prescribing the amount of baggage to be taken into the field. General Orders No. 130 and No. 160, limit officers' baggage to "blankets, one small valise or carpet-bag, and a moderate mess kit." Each soldier should have a knapsack, canteen, and haversack, and beside the suit he wears, (which should be in good condition,) a blanket, overcoat, and in his knapsack a change of shirts, drawers, and stockings. "Trunks and boxes will be ejected from wagon trains wherever found." These orders will be strictly executed.

II. Requisitions will be at once made to supply all deficiencies in ammunition, arms, clothing, and camp equipage.

III. Within five days after the promulgation of this Order, Brigade Commanders will have a thorough inspection of all their Regiments, and report, in writing, the names of parties neglecting to comply with its provisions.
