The envelopes, if in good condition, are more valuable than the letters in most instances, but if both are together, it increases the value somewhat. Therefore, if you decide to send these to me, please send all letters and envelopes. Also, be sure to send them in a good strong envelope, supported by cardboard on both sides, to prevent damage while in transit, or folding.

If they are not soiled or torn, they have much more value than if in poor condition. I suggest you send them first class mail, either Registered or Certified mail, for safety. I will be glad to give them my prompt attention, and advise you of the best price I can pay for the lot. As Fred Hunter told you, this material is one of my specialties, and you can be assured of a fair evaluation.

The other material which you described is of interest to some collectors of general Civil War material, but I do not handle those.

I will try to think of some reliable dealer who might be interested, and let you know; or, if you could get a copy of "HOBBIES" magazine I am sure you would find advertisements of some people who are interested in those items.
