

Rappahannock Station  
Aug. 3<sup>d</sup> 1863

Dear Sister

I received your  
letter to night & was glad  
to hear from you again.  
I thought I would answer your  
letter to night for I know  
you must be here same I  
want to hear from you  
by this time. I am well  
& we are laying here at  
the station (as what we  
call a station) there is not  
a building in sight of  
here all have burnt by a  
man as the <sup>by the</sup> rule. But the  
cars come up here every day  
& then go back again to  
Alexandria

There is no braving hand long  
we shall stay here as long  
as we shall live. We are  
throwing up entrenchments & making  
my rifle pits just as though  
they thought the Rebels was a going  
to attack us here. But we  
"Dabbs" dont know any thing  
only what we see.

I got a letter from Joe &  
Feveretia the other day. They  
say Lehas is with the Regt.  
& all right he is an old  
lucky one. (Like you)

I wish I could see you &  
see you to night I suppose  
you would be glad to see  
me. & I would like to see  
you & all the folks first  
rate. But it dont seem  
but a little while since?

place at home. But I have  
no doubt but what it  
will pass a great tribute to you.  
I may be at home again some  
time if I have good luck &  
my luck don't turn, I have  
been <sup>very</sup> lucky to get home once.  
But I think I shall see you  
all yet. We have got a good  
camp ground here & have  
a plenty of rations more  
than we ever got last year.  
Old Cal. Fuller & our  
old quartermaster raked  
us up half of our rations  
last year. & the old  
Dads are getting their pay  
for it now, they are under  
15000 dollars Bonds & the  
report is that Old Fuller  
is in states prison for 2  
years. I hope it is so.

For the old Piki deserves it  
We was cheated out of our  
rations & he got the  
profit of them. But we  
have all we can eat now  
& more too. I have not got  
any gun yet. But I shall get  
it next pay day. I can get  
a long until then well  
enough till I am paid.  
I dont know what to think  
of your going to 'Iarua' I  
am afraid you would not  
start at there. But if I was  
at home now, I dont know  
but I would go there with  
you. But for you to go there  
with no ~~any~~ friend except  
Joe Arum's folks & then if  
you should be sick you  
would need some support  
to fall back upon.



die with it as get discharged  
& the really remedy you have  
for it is to "die" for one  
and get discharged. I

since we came here

I just came to the right.

Well mate I don't  
know but I have made  
a hundred mistakes I should  
not it was to see for  
I cant. But if you are a  
school master you can  
read it. Give my

respects to "Grandpa"  
& "Granma" & "Machiasä"  
& "Carlson" & "Mynat" & aunt  
Mary & every body  
whom I know there  
or not & especially the  
"Galls."

I hope Mynat &  
Mary will be letters when  
you get this & tell  
them to write to me
