

DECORATION DAY, MAY 30, 1875

At three o'clock in the afternoon the procession was formed by Lieut. J. A. Cress in the following order:

- The Gettysburg Band
- Burgess and Town Council
- Prof. Pitzer's Choir
- The Sabbath Schools
- College Societies
- Normal School
- Citizens
- Children from Orphans' Homestead
- Drum Corps
- Post No. 9, G. A. R.

Rain ruined the first procession and exercises. A new procession was organized at 7 P.M. at Post Room. At the Homestead the Orphans entered the line of march.

The belated exercises closed with strewing the flowers by the Orphans and members of the Post.
