## Louisville Ky Oct 22, 1863

## Dear ones at home

Here I am getting over the ground at a mighty rate. You probably rec'd my letter written at Camp Chase. from there we went to Cincinnati and this side of Richmond I never saw men worse treated. I beg you to be excused from giving a description but ordinary <u>Hog pens</u> are about as clean. I have had pleasant rides however and have passed through some beautiful country and to night I crossed the Ferry at Jeffersonville into Louisville. I am feeling well and some what fatigued by the long rides but I will not grumble as I have not had to march it

We are in a very good place here but I hope soon to be in a place where I can get your letters. The City of L is considerable of a business town but does not suit me

Please give my love to all and I shall be till I get home again
