Dear Ones at Home

I take the greatest pleasure "although I am very tired" in writing you this eve We have moved back from our position so near the City and are at the RR near where it crosses the Chattahoochie I am well and have been hard at work since Sunday morning making preparations to recieve 400 raw Mules we are settling down for a considerable standstill by the looks of things--but from all I can learn our Corps is isolated from the rest and is guarding the Cumberland Dept. Trains while the rest of the troops are "up to some thing" I reckon The Lord is good to me and I sincerely desire to be his entirely but I find the "Old man Adam" often in the way But still I find that sweet promise the same "My grace is sufficient for thee" and I have been reading some of those precious promises in the same Bible I had presented to me Dec 25/1853 "It, I hope and believe is still a Lamp to my feet and a light to my path" and I pray it may ever be

I am still in the Correll tending the extra horses and mules

It is rather queer I do not recieve your letters they are not at the Regt there is some mistake somewhere when they do come they are <u>truly</u> acceptable I have yours of Aug 15 before me and gladly look it over thinking of you Our army had A nearly surrounded but the Johnnies had impregnable works so Billy Sherman is up to something else I rather think Lee did send some troops to A but how many I do not know 2 Divisions they report There are several bands in hearing and they do a great deal towards breaking the monotony of the evenings

Please send me some <u>Tribunes</u> and <u>N.Y. Heralds</u> if they can be had at a reasonable price. I want to see the other side of the question as it stands Union & the Constitution not Union on what one man says. I do not mean to have the papers sent all at once but from time to time send a copy of each when you get this. Please send some more paper & Envelopes as these are <u>playing out</u> but they are the source of a good deal of comfort to me I assure you. I do not know but I am in a fair way to find out the whereabouts of Mr Hartstone, when I do I will let you know.

I wouldn't wonder if the Pay master gave us a call before long then "How are you green Backs"

There is much that excites our minds regarding the coming election but we hope for the best and Pray for a speedy and happy issue of the war and a close in favor of Union & the Constitution Peace on earth & good will to men
