Feby 21 1865

I had not ought to let this Campaign go on with out writing some We are making a Desolation of S.C. Since we left the Ferry on the S River we have made rapid progress towards the land of Freedom and Abe Lincolns Proclamations. Among other towns that is laid low "Columbia," the nest egg of Secession is in ashes. The 20th AC did not go in to that place and it was burnt worse than any town we have passed through. Yesterday morn we started from Winnsboro where we staid the night before

The country up as far as Blackville is low and even but from there it gradually runs to Mountains and as far as the eye can reach here it is a succession of lofty hills. But the landscapes are of the most Beautiful description So far we have had pleasant weather but to night it rains some but it is warm and comfortable

Fayetteville N.C. March 12 1865

Dearest parents

It is exquisite happiness for me to sit and improve this 1st opportunity in writing a few lines. Dearest Home it seems to me this beautiful morning. I can truly thank my kind heavenly father for mercies recieved and send to you all sweetest love to all. This morning a clerk came to me and told me we could send out mails to day so I jumped and commenced. I shall not try to express my self very much this morn but write a few lines to tell of my welfare &c. We have made the present position all right and Boats come up from Wilmington this morning.

We had some little fighting before this place but our foragers took hold and chased the Johnies away over the River

I am well and hope you may be too. The country was beautiful and quite wealthy but war "where we have been" has made it a Desolation. We came here yesterday and expect to remain 3 or 4 days and then away we go to fulfill the errand we came so far on we are as well provided for as could possibly be expected. For some time we have been marching with the 14th A.C.

The Heroes of Chickamauga are somewhat embittered against the 20th because they find "Hookers feather bed soldiers" rather too much for them. Fayetteville is quite a nice looking town and it is Strongly guarded to prevent unnecessary ravages of our soldiers. Some time I will try and tell you more of our grand Successful march through S.C. & N.C. Spring will either show another long stride down hill of Lees army or Sherman gets one almighty thrashing

give Stella a sweet birthday kiss and remember me in kindest regards to all enquiring friends

It is so long since I have written my hand is very unsteady Please excuse as I know you will and I will close to write a few words elsewhere
