

Outline of my Military History.

Enrolled August 28, 1862, at Randolph N. Y. as private in Co. "H" 154 N. Y. Volunteers, mustered in with regiment September 26th, 1862 at Jamestown N. Y. Promoted to first sergeant April 1863 by Capt. J. F. Nelson, wounded and prisoner at Chancellorsville, May 3, 1863, and reported killed. Paroled and taken to Brooks station Va. May 13th 1863 and placed in Division Hospital, (camps then at Brooks station). Removed to Chestnut Hill General Hospital Philadelphia in June. Promoted to 2nd Lieutenant by Commission of Governor Seymour, dated June 11, 1863. Discharged from hospital September 17th 1863, and sent to Parol Camp at Alexandria, Va. October 16, exchange reported, and sent to regiment then at Bridgeport Ala, via B & O R'y'; reached Bridgeport late in October and at once assigned to duty as Acting Adjutant. December 29th mustered in as second lieutenant to date from July 6, 1863. Served as adjutant until about May 4th 1864. May 4 1864 assigned to Co "D" and put in command and continued in command until end of the war, also commanded Co E. for several months on the Atlanta Campaign.

Commissioned Captain by Governor *Fenton* date of Commission...

Mustered in as Captain at Atlanta October 16, 1864, and continued in command of Company "D".

At Savannah Ga. in December 1864 in an election held by order of Col. P. H. Jones by the officers of the regiment was elected Major, thereupon Col. Jones forwarded recommendation accordingly to Gov. *Fenton*.

At Galdsboro North Carolina April 1865 (about) received commission as major in first mail received after leaving Savannah. Date of Commission March 4th 1865. In grand review at Washington, May 25, 1865. ~~Was~~ Mustered out with regiment at Bladensburg Md. June 11, 1865. Finally discharged with regiment when disbanded at Elmira N. Y. June 23, 1865. Reached home at Worksburg Chautauqua County, N. Y. June 1865.

Memorandum.

Our regiment was first assigned to duty under General Sigel at Fairfax G. H. and then became a part of the 1st Brigade 2nd division 11

Army corps and so continued until the consolidation of 11 & 12th corps, at or about Chattanooga, in the spring of 1864 then placed in 2nd brigade 2nd Division 20th Army corps and continued in that brigade to the close of the war.

I was in every engagement that the regiment participated in, except the battle of Gettysburg, was then in hospital from wound at Chancellorsville.

The regiment marched with the brigade with a force commanded by Gen. Granger to the relief of Knoxville immediately from the Missionary Ridge battle field. It was also in the march from Atlanta to the sea, and from Savannah through the Carolinas to Raleigh, and from Raleigh after Gen. Lee's surrender ^{thru} Virginia to Washington, and was in the grand review. I was with the regiment every day for service from muster in September 26, 1862 to discharge June 23, 1865 except the time I was disabled from the Chancellorsville wound. was home on furlough for 15 days only when so convalescing from wound in hospital. While at Atlanta served on division court martial as junior officer. Also served on division court martial at Savannah. I was never mustered in as major, the regiment being below the minimum and having two field officers. Besides the war ended soon after M consideration was received. At the close of the war I was given a commission by Gov. ^{Frank} Stanton of N. Y. as a ^{Brink} Lieutenant Colonel. First and only application for pension Feb'y 19, 1907, under McCumber service pension law. Pension granted Jan'y 5, 1907 Cert. No 1133571
