Annual Taxes for

The attention of tax-payers is hereby called to the provisions of the United States Tax Law relating to the assessment of annual taxes.

By the sixth section of the act of 1862, made the duty of all persons, partnerships, corporations, made liable to taxation, or tax, on or before the 1st of MAY IN EACH YEAR, to make up an Assistant Assessor of the District who shall assess the amount of annual income, the articles with a special tax, and the business liable to pay any license.

Every person who shall fail to make the day specified will be liable to be assessed according to the best information obtainable; and in such case the Assessor will be entitled to pay five percentum to the amount collected.

Every person who shall deliver to a false or fraudulent list or statement evade the valuation or enumeration is subject to a fine of five hundred dollars, and the list will be made out by the Assistant Assessor, and from the valuation so made there can be no appeal.

Payment of the annual taxes, except real estate, will not be demanded until the 1st of June.

The appropriate blanks on which to enter all necessary information, will be sent to Austin, Wadsworth of Randolph, for the 9th District of Allegany, for the 9th Boardman of Cean, for the 10th Judge of Franklin, for the 11th Marsh of Yorkshire, for the 12th Day and Remington of East Ashford, for the Office of the said Assistant several assessment district in the County, to whom the returns should be sent for the 1st Monday of May, at the seven o'clock.
