February, WEDNESDAY 1

FRIDAY 3.

We have received more or less all day until time set back in the afternoon when we broke camp to march but did not go more than half a mile when we turned around and marched back to the old camp

February, SATURDAY 4, 1865

Started from camp this morning at six o'clock and crossed the river at half past ten A.M. and then found the worst road I ever saw. Marched about seven miles. Arrived picked to night. Weather fair and warm

February, MONDAY 6, 1865

To day we are the rear guard for the Oregon train. Start out ten o'clock A.M. We have passed through a good deal of snow. Though the roads were probably fair. Marched about twelve miles. Have had a drifting snow nearly all day.

SUNDAY 5.

TUESDAY 7.

Broke camp at twelve M. and marched about eight miles. Marched very rapid. The roads are all good. Weather fair and warm

Started this morning at half past eight. Our road has been very bad to day. We have crossed and big snow. We marched about seven miles to day. It has rained hard nearly all day.

February, WEDNESDAY 8, 1865

Started this morning at six o'clock and made about fifteen miles. Have passed through a good deal of snow. Stopped for the night at a town called Bramford. Weather fair but rather cool.

THURSDAY 9.

Started this morning at six o'clock and marched about twelve miles and stopped for the night at a little town called Blackville. The road has been very good to day. I saw a few flakes of snow this fore noon. Weather is pretty cold.

February, FRIDAY 10, 1865

Moved to day about a half miles. Spent out a foraging. Traveled about ten miles. Weather fair but cool. One year from to day if all is well G. P. Brown and wife is to make one or visit. For supper chicken pot pie in case I have a wife.

SATURDAY 11.

Started on the march again this morning at seven o'clock and marched about five miles and camped for dinner. We are train guard to day. Marched this afternoon at half mile and camped for the night.

February, SUNDAY 12, 1865

Broke camp this morning at six o'clock and marched about thirteen miles and found the right branch of the Edisto river. Crossed one branch of the same river which we first started out this morning. Weather fair and warm.

MONDAY 13

Crossed the other branch of the Edisto this morning at six o'clock. Traveled about five miles to day. Was quite warm. Yesterday, am better to day. Had skirmishing on our front to day. Weather clear but cool.

February, TUESDAY 14, 1865

Started this morning at eight o'clock and marched about six miles. We are train guard to day. Got in to camp at two o'clock P.M. It has rained all the afternoon.

WEDNESDAY 15.

Started this morning at seven o'clock and marched eleven miles. The road has been good. Have had some skirmishing on our front to day. Have had some rain to day.

February, THURSDAY 16, 1865

Started this morning at eight o'clock and marched about nine miles & camped for the night. We fired four miles and a half of Columbia. Was train guard to day. Weather is fair and warm.

FRIDAY 17.

Started this morning at nine o'clock and marched about five miles. Am train guard to day. Weather fair and warm.

February, SATURDAY 18, 1865

Started this morning at nine o'clock and marched with the train made about ten miles to day. Crossed the Saluda river this morning. Weather fair and warm. Roads good to day.

SUNDAY 19.

Broke camp at one P.M. and marched about three miles. Weather fair and very warm.

February, MONDAY 20, 1865

The Corps marched to day eight miles & was out a foraging and went at least twelve miles. Weather fair and warm. Crossed the broad river this morning.

TUESDAY 21.

Broke camp this morning at six o'clock & marched nine miles & stopped at a place called Winstons, at a very pretty village. Tore up rail road this afternoon. Weather fair and warm.

February, WEDNESDAY 22, 1865

Trusted rail road iron until two P.M. when we started and marched seven miles. The country this afternoon was quite rough. Weather fair and warm.

THURSDAY 23.

Broke camp this morning at six o'clock and marched fifteen miles. Crossed the Catawba river. Got into camp at eight P.M. Marched all night.

February, FRIDAY 24, 1865

Broke camp this morning at ten o'clock and marched with the train made about four miles to day. It has rained almost steadily all day.

SATURDAY 25.

Have laid in camp all day. It has rained a good share of the day.

February, SUNDAY 26, 1865

Started this morning at seven o'clock and marched eight miles. The road was pretty bad. I have been quite unwell to day. Our regiment was on picket the night.

MONDAY 27.

Left the picket post at half past two P.M. and marched about four miles and camped for the night. Weather fair to day.

February, TUESDAY 28, 1865

Broke camp this morning at half past six o'clock and marched eight miles. The roads were very bad. It has rained nearly all day. Was distressed. This afternoon for two months were heavy.

March, WEDNESDAY 1.

Started to day at noon and marched to the rear of the corps train made seven miles. Crossed the Big Lynches creek to night. Weather cloudy but not much rain. Crossed the Little Lynches creek yesterday.

March, THURSDAY 2, 1865

Started to day at nine o'clock A.M. and marched with the train and made seven miles. Got in to camp at two P.M. Weather cloudy but not much rain.

FRIDAY 3.

Started this morning at seven o'clock and marched with the train and made twelve miles. Reached Chesterfield Court house. Got in to camp at ten o'clock at night. Our regiment is on picket to night.



March, SATURDAY 4, 1865

This morning started with a foraging and got a head of the advance guard and got arrested and held all day and night. Weather cloudy and some rain. Marched ten miles to day. Crossed the Gunter creek this morning.

SUNDAY 5.

Have been in camp all day. Was released from arrest today noon.

March, MONDAY 6, 1865

Started this morning at seven o'clock and marched fifteen miles. Crossed the river Pedee at Cheraw. Saw Genl Francis Marion's grave. Cheraw cemetery. Weather fair and warm.

TUESDAY 7.

Started this morning at six o'clock and marched thirteen miles and stopped for the night at the Wallingburg town rail road. Had up some of the track. Weather fair and warm.

March, WEDNESDAY 8, 1865

Started to day at one o'clock P.M. and marched seven miles. Was clear in the rear of the Corps. Got in the camp at eleven o'clock P.M. It has rained steadily all day.

THURSDAY 9.

Broke camp at half past six and marched twelve miles. It began to rain about three o'clock. This afternoon and rained steadily until eight P.M.

March, FRIDAY 10, 1865

Started to day at seven o'clock and marched about three miles. Have crossed a good deal of swamp. Crossed the Lumber river to day. Weather cloudy with some rain. Was picket the night.

SATURDAY 11.

Started at seven o'clock and marched twelve miles and got in the camp at four o'clock in the morning. Crossed Buffalo & Rockfish creeks today. We have had to cross a good deal of swamp to day. Weather fair and warm.

March, SUNDAY 12, 1865

Started at eleven o'clock and marched fourteen miles and stopped for the night at Fayetteville. It is a very pretty town.

MONDAY 13

Left Fayetteville at one P.M. and crossed the Cape Fear river and marched four miles. Weather fair and warm.

March, TUESDAY 14, 1865

Have laid in camp all day. Weather fair and warm.

WEDNESDAY 15.

Started to day at half past three P.M. and marched until five o'clock in the morning and made only six miles. It has rained nearly all day and night.

March, THURSDAY 16, 1865

Started at seven o'clock this morning and did not get in to camp until six the next morning and only made seven miles. The road was very bad to day. Considerable rain to day.

FRIDAY 17.

Started on again at noon and crossed the South river and made five miles. Weather fair and warm.

March, SATURDAY 18, 1865

Started at half past six this morning and made seven miles. Saw Peach and Plum trees in bloom to day. Weather fair and warm. Our regiment is on picket to night.

SUNDAY 19

Started at half past six, this morning and marched ten miles. Heard considerable cannonade on to day on our left. Weather fair and warm. Went on picket to night at ten o'clock.

Went back five miles to help the train up. The roads were very bad. Stopped at Smith field last night. Crossed the Canal river to night and stopped two miles beyond for the night. Made twelve miles to day. Weather fair

April, THURSDAY 13,

Started this morning at six o'clock and marched fourteen miles. Got in the camp at ten P.M. Weather fair and warm. Nice country to day.

FRIDAY 14.

Started this morning six o'clock and marched nine miles and stopped for the night near Raleigh. Weather fair and very warm.

April, SATURDAY 15, 1865

Went over to the one hundred and twelfth St. G. to day. Saw some of the boys that I was acquainted with. We have had a good deal of rain to day.

SUNDAY 16.

Have been to the city of Raleigh to buy a duty book and a few other things. The service was a good one. Read up at ten to night that and found I had more money than I needed. This whole day very warm and fair.
