
The Collector's Receipt shown below shows payment of taxes on the Bollow farm home on Town Line, Town of Ellicottville, County of Cattaraugus, for the year of 1910. This Collector's Receipt was borrowed from the files of Marjorie Bollow Stadler in Feb. 1982; these files include many more of these Collector's Receipts. Note that the name of Frederick Bollow, Jr. is written as Ballow on this receipt.

COLLECTOR'S RECEIPT.

"The Collector shall deliver a receipt to each person paying a tax. specifying the date of such payment, the name of such person, the description of the property as shown on the assessment roll, the name of the person to whom the same is assessed, the amount of such tax and the date of the delivery to him of the assessment roll on account of which such tax was paid. For the purpose of giving such receipt each Collector shall have a book of blank receipts, so arranged that when a receipt is torn therefrom a corresponding stub will remain. The State Board of Tax Commissioners shall prescribe the form of such receipts, stubs and books, and they shall be furnished to the Collector by the Board of Supervisors, at the expense of the county. At the time of giving such a receipt the Collector shall make the same entries on the corresponding stub as are required to be made on the receipt. Such book shall be subject to public inspection and shall be filed by the Collector, with his return together with the assessment roll in the office of the County Treasurer,"—Sec. 34, ch. 908, laws '96, amended by ch. 489, laws '97.
