While serving in Co. B, 1574 Reg't N.Y. Vols he was disabled by

Typhoid fever and results, Chronic diarrhoea, diseases of Stomach, bowels, back and kidneys and piles, at Arlington Heights Va September 25 1862

Oct. 12, 1862.


Surgeons certificate of disability
