FIRST GAS WELL IN LAND

redonia Trustees Plan Celebration of Event 110 Years Ago.

Fredonia, Feb. 10.—In commemoraon of the drilling of the first gas well the United States, nearly 110 years to, trustees of this village are planing a celebration.

Surface gas on Canadaway Creek as first noticed by the early settlers 1820 and in the following year a ell was drilled on the bank of the ream which produced 2,000 cubic et a day for several years.

The second gas well was discovered a burning spring at Barcelona, near estfield, four years later, and for a wey years the government lighthouse that point was illuminated with gas imped from the spring through hole logs.

"It is the home spot for me and aine.



DEATH OF JOHN BOOTH

John Booth, a Civil war veteran, who has been in failing health for over a year, entered into rest on Saturday night, Feb. 15, 1930, at the home of his son, Bert Booth, on Clinton street, in the 92nd year of his age.

Mr. Booth was born April 8, 1838, on Washington street, (where MissShaw now lives). He has lived in and near Westfield all his life, and is the only one left out a family of nine children. He was in the 154 Reg. Co. E., N. Y. Vol., under Capt. Fay. He was associated in the shoe making business first with his father, learning the trade, and then he worked 12 years and six months with Jonas Harrington. He was 91 years old the eighth day of April, 1929.

He is survived by two sons, Bert of this village, and Ed. near Prospect, eight-grand children and nine great grand children. The funeral will be held from his late home on Clinton street Wednesday afternoon, at 2
