

EASON BULL --CIVIL WAR

Eason Bull b. 20 April 1837; d, 19 Feb. 1863; m. Speedy Hall 1 Jan. 1862. He was born in Yorkshire, NY.; son of Carpenter Bull and Mariah Bump. He was their 6th child. He married Miss. Hall in Ashford, NY. Enlisted in the Vol. Army on July 31, 1862; Co. D; 154 th Reg. at Jamestown, NY; Col. Addison G. Rice was commander until they reached the front then Col. Patrick H. Jones. The 154th left Jamestown on Sept. 28, 1862, received their arms and equipment at Elmira, and reached Washington on the 1st of October. There they served under Gen. Sigal "Flying Lutchman".

Eason died at Stafford Court house, Va. of typhoid fever. His grave is No. 5664 in Fredricksburg National Cemetery, Va. His widow was living in Alexander, NY in Feb. 1864 when she applied for a widow's pension of \$8 per mo. She was 16 years old living with her sister Abigail Morgenstern. This inf. I received from the National Archives & Hist. of Catt. Co. 1879 Everts.

Eason came from a family of 1st settlers. His father came to WNY about 1820 from Danby, Vt. His greatgrandfather, Crispin Bull was one of 5 families to settle Danby in 1765, Crispin's Timothy was one of the first settlers in 9 Partners, NY across from Conn. His grandfather was one of the 1st settlers of Woomsocket, RI. Isaac Bull --1714.

Eason's mothers side was also 1st settlers. She was born in Mt. Holley, Vt. The Lumps were 1st settlers there as well as Cannan, Ct. Rochester and Luxbury, Mass. Edward Lumpasse the 1st. Imm. came over on the "Fortitude" in 1621 from England. He landed at Plymouth Colony as a "lusty young man" on the 2nd. ship to land there.

The Lumps were one of the 1st settlers of the Yorkshire & China (Aracde), Genesee Co. N.Y. area (1810)

Footnote on Eason's marriage;

According to their marriage licence they were married on Jan.1,1862. He was 25 and she was 14 which was not unusual at that time. From his letters I don't think it was a happy marriage.
