**Funeral Of Burdick Kirk To Be Thursday**

Last Rites For Respected Young Man Will Be Held From M. E. Church, Thursday at 2:30 P. M.

The community was greatly shocked late Monday afternoon to hear that Burdick Kirk had passed away at the McPherson Memorial Hospital following an operation for appendicitis. Mr. Kirk was taken ill Saturday night and rushed to the hospital where the operation was performed Sunday morning. Monday noon complications appeared and despite all that medical aid could do, he passed to his reward shortly before six o'clock. Funeral services will be held from the M. E. church Thursday at 2:30 o'clock, Rev. Hugh Townley of Corunna, officiating, assisted by Rev. Geo. Curtis.

Arlington Burdick Kirk, son of Arlington and Mary E. Kirk was born in Hartland, Mich., October 18th, 1895, and departed this life Monday evening September 12th, 1932. The deceased attended the Hartland schools and the Michigan State College, and on Sept. 3rd, 1919, was united in the bonds of matrimony to Bertha Elene Whitacker in Howell, Mich. To this union two children were born, Martha Arlene, aged 11 years, and Mary Elene, 6 years, who with the bereaved wife survive him.

Mr. Kirk was engaged in the tire and battery business in partnership with Henry Herbst, and later entered the civil service and was employed as substitute clerk-carrier and rural carrier at the Howell post office. He was a member of the M. E. church and a regular attendant at the Sunday school.

Besides the bereaved wife and children, the deceased is survived by his mother, Mrs. Mary Kirk, two sisters, Mrs. Fred Preston of Hartland and Mrs. C. H. Rayl of Kentucky, and a host of relatives and friends who mourn his passing.
