I am very much pleased with Willys list of affairs but it is much more than I thought it was. but Father you have bought you a pare of boots so I will have to keep mine. I was a going to buy me titer pair and fetch these Home for you but never mind. I can wear these if they be heavy so its all right ennyhow.

Oh how my back pains me now in fact i ake all over I have sit up to much. but I must finish this letter to send to night. Oh father those verses are good and true. why this cup it may be bitter but I will drink it. Crist drank his cup and a cup that was bitter. He did not refuse to dye for us poor creachers that we might live, and the Lord was well pleased with his son, yet that was this lot and this is mine. and my Fathers love for his son is great also, and so is mine for Him and also for my Mother and brother. I recieved a letter from aunt Martha the other day, they are all well I believe and I answered it yesterday, recieved a letter from Wm. E. Taylor the 9th from R they are well as comon I believe, but I am so tired I must close. Oh Mother the names of those good boys, ones name is Farde and the other Woodard, they are both Corporals and I have very good talk with them, but how long they will stay I no not
