WAS BORN IN FREEDOM.

Jerry Whitney of Portville and Col. Harrison Cheney, 80 Years of Age, Still Serving as Mail Clerk.

> Uncle Sam does not discard his faithful servants on account of age. An example of this statement is in the record of Harrison Cheney, railway mail clerk in the railway postal service, who is serving in the capacity of postal clerk between Rochester and Olean, and who, if he lives until Jan. 3rd next, will be 80 years old.

He was born at Freedom, Cattaraugus county. After receiving his education at the common schools and at Arcade seminary, he taught mine winter terms of school and labored on his father's farm in summer. But this quiet farmer's life was not to continue. At the breaking out of the civil war, he was too true a patriot not to be aroused to action and in August, 1862, he recruited every man of Company D., 154th New York Volunteers and had more applicants than he could receive. It is said that he was the only man who recruited, personally, every man of a company in this state.


Cheney was commissioned captain at its organization. He was engaged at the battle of Chancellorsville and was captured by the enemy at Gettysburg. On the ninth day of his capture, while marching under guard through a piece of woods near Martinsburg, he broke from the ranks and ran, was hotly pursued into the woods, but escaped and was a fugitive for 22 days before he reached the Union army. Colonel Chency's account of his escape from the Southern forces is both thrilling and interesting and he has been called to recount this chapter in his life. 
