Camp Near Fairbourn

Dear Sister

it is with
pleasure that I take my
pen in hand to write
you a few lines to let
you know that I am
well and hope these
few lines will find
you the same

It has been some time
~~since~~ I have had a letter
from home and I thought
I would write a few lines
to tell you that we
had been in battle again
Seymour Wright was killed
and there was seven more
of the Company wounded

there was sixty eight wounded
and four killed in the
Regiment

We got our pay a few days
ago and I have expressed ~~the~~
thirty dollars to Father and
if he hasn't got it when
you get this letter he
will find it at the
express office.

I want Father to take
that thirty dollars and
get the rest of that that
Mr Myers owes me and what
Sy Walkes owes me and
~~the~~ take it all to Mr Miller
and settle with him I think
there will be enough to pay
him all that is due him for
the land and if there is
any of the money left tell
Father he may have it

Oh them boots that Pa
sent me I forget them I was
him to pay for them

I will put a two dollar
bill in this letter for you
I promised to send you
a gold dollar if you would
send me stamps but I could
not get one to send you so
I thought I would send you a
two dollar bill

I was over to the 154th Regt
yesterday I saw Sid Cross and
lots of the Randolph and
Cold Spring boys that I was
acquainted with Sid and
John Babeck was over here
yesterday to see the boys
You asked me a while ago
if I ever got that dollars
worth of stamps that
you sent me last spring
I never did get them the

letter must have been
mis-carried

But I will close
for this time hoping to
hear from you soon
