Perhaps they will call again. Send me no more provisions or Money as it cannot be received by me at present As there is an Order issued against it here I hope soon to be released from here and Perhaps I may come and make you all a visit I am well supplied with clothing & provisions for the present Capt. Weld is here and well I do not get much general news now as I do not go out I remain in doors & we are very well guarded so that we have nothing to fear from outsiders Please write me again & Remember me to your Wife & Family and also to all my friends
