Danford L. Hall passed to the life immortal, Sept. 3, 1904.

He was born Sept. 26, 1844 in the town of Allegany in which town he spent nearly all his life.

He was a soldier of the civil war and followed the old flag almost three years and during the many battles in which he participated received a wound from which, together with the results of exposure and hardships, he suffered to the time of his decease.

He was a comrade of the G. A. P. under whose auspices the funeral services were conducted. Dr. Ashton of Olean read the following scripture lesson and paid tribute to the service to his country in words full of sympathy and soulful kindness, and he was tenderly laid to rest beneath the dear flag to whose defense he devoted the strongest years of his young manhood.

His wife whose faithful care smoothed his pathway through the clouded valley, daughter Miss Nettie, son Clifford and sister, Mrs. T. J. McKnight of Wevatchu, Washington, are the immediate relatives who survive.
