Mr. Halter enlisted in
Company A. 154th New
York Volunteer Infantry
in the Civil War. His
regiment was assigned
to the 12th Army Corps
of the Potomac. He took
part in numerous

battles of Vix. After the
battle of Chancellorsville
Vermont, the 11th & 12th
Corps were consolidated
and were send to
Bridgeport Alabama &
formed the 20th corps,
Army of the Cumberland.

His command took a
prominent part in rais-
ing the siege of Chattan-
ooga, when General
Rosecrans was pinned
in by the Rebel army
under General Bragg.

The 20th Corps stormed
Lookout Mts. under
command of Gen Hooker.
This battle is known
as the battle above the
clouds.

Mr. Hatter's command
now composed part of
Gen. Sherman's Army in
their great advance
through the fortified
mountains of eastern
Tennessee and northern
Georgia enduring un-
told hardships and danger

and privations resulting
in the final capture of
Atlanta then on and
through Georgia from
Atlanta to the sea.
Then north through
the Carolinas to the
surrender of the Rebel
Army under Gen. J. E.
Johnson in N. Carolina
Apr. 26, 1865. To Sherman's
army. Then a leisurely
and peaceful march
across Virginia to the
city of Washington to

take part in the great
review and then home

Truly the record of Carrad

also marched with Sher-
man through Georgia.
