### Old Veteran Dead.

Theodore Charles Harnes died at St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Lincoln Dec. 1 of hemorrhage of the brain. The body was brought to his home in DeWitt Tuesday and on Wednesday funeral services were held in the M. E. church Rev. Shafer officiating.

The deceased came to DeWitt in the early '80's and except for a brief period had resided here every since. Originally he was engaged in training bird dogs for a sportsmen's club in Chicago and collected a salary that looked big in those days. For several of his later years he was a rural mail carrier. He was popular for his friendliness and generosity, traits of character that remained with him during his long life.

He was a veteran of the Civil War and the locus Post of G. A. R. paid its tribute at the funeral.

He was born at Ellicottville, N. Y., Dec. 17, 1837, and at the time of his death lacked but a few days of being 82 years old. He leaves a wife and seven children as follows: Mrs. Iola Rhodes, New Albion, N. Y.; Mrs. Libbie Duggan, Arvilla, William, Esther, Ruth and Frank Harnes of DeWitt. The first two children were by a former marriage.
