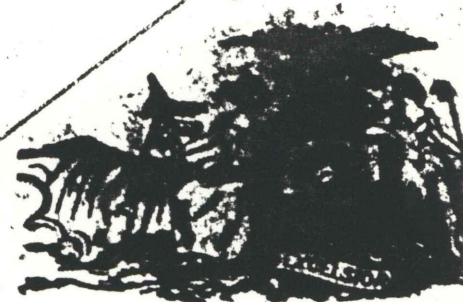

Vols. in July 1862 and served until the close of the war. He moved to the West shortly after the close of the War, living there up to the time of his death.
