A petition was presented this week, in the House of Representatives, asking an appropriation by Congress of \$75,000, of Government bonds, in aid of the extension of the buildings and enlargement of the operations, of the Homestead located in this place. This petition is signed by General Meade, Bishop Simpson, and other prominent citizens of Philadelphia, and has been referred to the Committee on Military affairs. Some years ago, property valued at \$76,000 was given to the state home for Towa Soldiers, and like bounty has been shown to other institutions.
