Febuary the 20th 1863

Respected friend Cassius

I received your leter last night were glad to here from

you and to here that you was well

I do not feel any better to day than I did the day I wrote to you before but I think that I shall get well after a while if I am carfull

And I am glad to here that you are going to school this winter

It is very pleasant here to day only the wind blows quite

harde we halve not had much snow here this winter

I halve not got any pay since I started from Jamestown and do not know when I shall get any I shall not write you a very long letter to day for my hand trembles very bad and I halve not got much news to write and I will write again to you as soon as I get an ansure from this

I suppose you have plenty of apples this winter to eat We

do not get any only what we buy

But we get oranges once an a while that the ladies bring

in to us

You can tell Cate and Melissa that I will write them a letter apeice and they will find it at fredomia at the ofice

A lady has brot us in some wine I just had a glass and

wish you had some

I would like to go in and see the school but I gues that I shall not this winter and I would like to see all of my old school maits once more and tell Pa that I have halve not forgot him and that I ment to write to him before this time but I halve had some considerrable writing to do and halve not writen to him but tell him not to wait for mea but write and give my best respects to all of the school and tell them all to write to mea and I want you should write as soon as you get this no more for this time from your friend
