Camp of the 154 Regt N Y S V Icokout Valey Tenn Febuary the 24th 1864

Friend Cassius

I received a letter from you the 21st Was glad to from you and here you was well but was sorry to here your Mother was so sick I was in hopes that she would be well by the time I got answerd? from the letter that I wrote to you before I am in hopes that she will be beter by the time you get this

Cap is well and the Rest of the Co It is very warm and pleasant here to day we had inspection to day we had our guns so that we could see our fases in the barels but do not know how long this will last but not long I think if

we would halve ordars to march

I spoke to Miland and told him what you wanted mea to and he said he would write to you I do not know wheather he has writen yet or not

It is such nise weather here now that I do not think we will have the privlage of staing in this camp much longer I would not be much surprised if we hurd the Cannons wroer

again beforelong if we halve to go to the front

I wish you was here to go on the mountain with mea next Saturday if it was pleasant day but there is no use of wishing as I know of so I will stop for if wishing would do any good I would wish for a great many things I am afraid

For about the first thing I should wish for would be to

halve this crewel war to come to a close

Marvin is geting a cup of coffee for dinner and I shall halve to stop writing soon and take dinner for it is after 12 oclock now

I will try and write a longer letter next time Write to mea soon and give mi best respects to all of the Folks yours in respect
