Enlisted July 26, 1862 from the state of Ohio and was mustered into the United States Service at Jamestown, New York as a private to serve for a term of 3 years in

**Company C. 154<sup>th</sup> Regiment – New York Vol. Infantry**

Under Captain Lewis D. Warner W.F. Chapman H. Martin and J.L. Harding Colonel A.G. Rice and Patrick H. Jones. The regiment was attached to 11<sup>th</sup> Corps Army of the Potomac and the Cumberland, to April 1864 then 20<sup>th</sup> Corps Army of the Cumberland. Participated in the Battle of Chancellorsville, Va. May 1-4 1863 Gettysburg Penna. July 1-3 1863. He was **CAPTURED** Held a prisoner at Belle Island and Libby Prisons, Richmond Va. 2 months. Exchanged prior to Feby. 29, 1864 and Rejoined Regiment in Lookout Valley. Engaged in battles at Rocky Faced Ridge, Ga. May 8-11 Dug Gap May 8 '64 Battle of Resaca Ga. May 14-15 '64 near Cassville May 19 New Hope Church Ga. May 25 1864 was **WOUNDED** by gunshot in left Hand was in Cumberland Hospital Nashville Tenn. 2 months then rejoined the Regiment. Siege of Atlanta November 9, 1864. **MARCH TO THE SEA** Nov. 15 to Dec. 10 1864. Siege of Savannah Ga. Dec. 10-21, 1864 Campaign of the Carolinas Jany. to April 1865 Engaged at Averasboro N.C.
