it is with pleasure that I sit my old to work to let you no that I am still in the land of living and trying to enjoy my self, but I find lots of trials that almost discourages me, But to night I hear news that would encourage the most down hearted person in the world that is this the Ennemy is entirely surrounded and there is no chance for them to retreat, we are now within 10 miles of the Rebels in Richmond we drove them across this Bridge on the 20<sup>th</sup> we had 3 hours of firing fighting But when we got them started they went like a flock of sheep

with as many dogs after them  
we only had two Regts on them they  
Belong to our Brigade we was in  
plain sight of the hull thing but  
as we was not wanted we did not  
go. I will never tell you a little  
more of the War. Berry Battle as  
we know mean the we was going  
up to the field of Battle we run  
thru the ranks of the 49 regtens  
doing this it has given us a big  
name by all of the big men in  
this Division this is a quite a help  
to us it is so much they talk of  
leaving us to guard this Bridge  
while the rest has to fight and  
take Richmond if there is any fighting  
to be done, it is thought they will  
surrender and finer will smile  
again in the continent of America  
and the union will be reunited  
this will be a happy hour for us  
poor soldiers; I will now say

that I am well and hope these  
few lines will find you the same  
I am very sorry to hear of your  
Mother's illness and hope it will  
not last long. Wilber is pretty sick  
I received a letter from him to  
day he has gone back to Washington  
he does it ~~you have not~~ if you  
had had any news from home  
write and tell them to me, he  
says he has got the Bileous Fever  
but thinks he is a little better  
he also regrets we to send  
him some money if I have  
any let spare for it was a  
quite a long time before he  
went to the Hospital and it  
cost him all of his money  
to pay his bill where he staid  
I feel it my duty to send  
him some, I just put in  
\$15<sup>00</sup> for him in a letter which  
he will get as quickly as it will  
go.
