## Gettisbirg Aug 2Qth 1863

Dear father and mother i recived yours of the 9 yesterday and a nother to day containing apice of paper and 12 stamps it truly is a great mercy that i have been spared but should i be called to dy in defince of liberty truth and Justes my life would not be spint in vain if i under stand your letter you object is to perswaid me that a soldier cannot be saved but you must first show me that it is rong to have any government for if it is write to have any government it must be rite to sustain it and in this case that cannot be dun without war i should like to know if daba and johnaton did not go to heven the same as all sinners they believed in as aviour to come and we believe in a saviour that hath come which is only a diference in time not in fath.
