# NONAGENARIAN PASSES AT SOUTH NINE MILE HOME LAST SUNDAY

## Former Allegany Resident

*d. July 9, 1910*  
Charles Reynolds, a former Allegany resident, died at his home in Salamanca last Saturday evening after a protracted illness.

He was a veteran of the Civil War serving in Company C, 154, N. Y. regulars and a member of Sherwood Post G. A. R. of Salamanca. Deceased was 68 years of age and lived in Allegany until about 17 years ago when he moved to Salamanca where he became the owner and proprietor of the hotel Wildwood. Besides his wife, he is survived by one daughter, Miss Reynolds, and one son, Alfred W., two brothers, Ben of East Olean, John and a half-brother, William Drake of Portville. His remains were brought to Allegany for burial in the Allegany cemetery. The family has the sympathy of a large circle of Allegany friends.

Mrs. Maria Reynolds Was Almost 91 Years of Age; Funeral Held At St. Bonaventure Church Last Tuesday Morning.

In the passing of Mrs. Maria Helderer Reynolds, widow of Charles Reynolds, we are called upon to chronicle the taking from our midst another of our noblest pioneer residents.

For the past five years Mrs. Reynolds, while her mind was clear to the last, has been slowly declining in bodily strength and when the end came last Sunday morning, she went to sleep like a tired child, attaining the high old age of 90 years and 7 months.

Her husband who died July 10, 1910, at the age of 68 years, was a Civil War veteran, enlisting in Co. C, 164th New York Volunteers.

Mrs. Reynolds was born in Buffalo, May 4, 1850, and in 1856 she came with her parents to Allegany and had lived here most of that time since.

She is survived by one daughter, Miss Ada B. Reynolds of Salamanca; two sons, Alfred Reynolds of Tulsa, Okla., Allen G. Reynolds at whose home she died; two grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Prayers were recited at the farm home on the South Nine Mile Tuesday morning at 8:30 o'clock and the funeral services were held at St. Bonaventure church at 9:30. Rev. Bertin O'Neill, OFM, was celebrant of the high mass. The remains were laid at rest in the Allegany cemetery.
