O. D. Rhodes, Veteran of Civil War, dies at Home in Great Valley

Otis D. Rhodes, veteran of the Civil War and father of Frank A. Rhodes of this city, died this morning at 12.45 at his home in Great Valley, aged 87 years, five months and 22 days.

Mr. Rhodes was the son of Asahel and Agnes P. Fair Rhodes, and was born in Napoli October 3, 1840.

Following the outbreak of the War, Mr. Rhodes enlisted in Company B, New York Infantry, being mustered into service September 24, 1862. He was mustered out of the service June 11, 1865. He was a past commander of Post 357, G. A. R., of Great Valley.

He married Sarah Jane Milks October 1, 1867. He moved to Great Valley February 1, 1862, and had lived there since.

His widow survives him, together with two daughters, Mrs. Grace M. Frank of Buffalo and Mrs. Carrie E. Clark of Great Valley; two sons, Frank, of this city, and George O. Rhodes of Fredonia, and 10 grandchildren. One daughter, Cora, died in infancy.

The funeral will be held Sunday afternoon, at 1.30 from the home and at 2 o'clock from the U. B. church in Great Valley. Burial will be in Wildwood cemetery here.
