Corydon A. Rugg, son of Dr. Corydon C. & Fidelia (Goodell) Rugg was born at Irving, Chaut. Co., N.Y. Apr. 1803,

His great grandfather was Isaac Rugg born near Bloody Point, Vt. and served in Revolutionary war and died in Ruggtown. His first wife was Katie Gates and had one child, Jonathan (grandfather). After her death he married Emma Matson who died and left 2 children, John & Aurelia. His third wife was Abigail Skinner and had 10 children.

Jonathan was in the War of 1812 and he married Maria Tousey and reared a family of four sons and two daughters; Carlos A. of Silver Creek, a veterinary surgeon in Union County; Milton V., one of the California forty-niners and died 1853; Dr. Jonathan G. of Gowanda; Mariette, wife of Dr. C.G. Cowell of Meadville, Pa., who is a graduate of Hahnemann Medical College of Chicago; Dr. Corydon C., died Jan. 14, 1891¹⁸⁹¹, and Ann M. who died 1883^{WEST PENNSYLVANIA}.

Dr. Corydon C. Rugg was born at Ruggtown, Catt. Co., May 3, 1822. At twenty years of age he commenced the study of medicine under the Thompson who founded the Thompsonian Eclectic system of Medicine and was graduated in 1848 from the Cincinnati Medical College. He practiced in Gowanda for 25 years and then in Rutland, Vt. for four years after which he came in 1877 to Jamestown where he practiced ever since. He was surgeon of 154th. regiment N.Y. Vols, was taken prisoner at Gettysburg and after his release served at Lookout Mountain and under Sherman in his march to the sea. He had two sons and four daughters: Adelia D. who married John F. Clark, real estate dealer of Detroit, Mich.; Laella V., wife of Orris F. Johnston; Corydon A. of Jamestown; assistant superintendent of Knitting Milling A. F. Kent & Co.; Estella F., wife of Walter D. Russell, formerly of N.Y. City; Clayton A. who married Catherine M. O'Donnell and is engaged in clothing business and Minnie M., wife of Fred Jay Sherman of Jamestown.
