

DR. C. C. RUGG.

Jamestown Journal of Jan.
retract the following in relation
recent death of Dr. Rugg in that
city on Jan. 14, 1891:

"Dr. Corydon C. Rugg died at his home,
No. 744 East Second street Wednesday
evening aged 69 years. Dr. Rugg had
long been a sufferer from the effects of
paralysis. He had been a resident of
Jamestown for many years and was widely
known throughout the country. Besides a
wife he leaves six children, Corydon and
Clayton A. Rugg of Jamestown; Mrs. W.
D. Marks of Detroit, Mich; Mrs. E. F.
Russell and Mrs. E. J. Shearman of James-
town."

Dr. Rugg was a brother of Dr. J. G.
Rugg of this village, and was for many
years a resident of Gowanda, where he
enjoyed a large and successful practice in
his profession. In the war of the rebellion
he was surgeon of the 154th N. Y. Vols.,
and at the time of his death was drawing
a pension for disabilities contracted while
in the service. He had a large circle of
friends in this vicinity, and his old com-
rades of the 154th Regt., to whom he had
rendered invaluable aid in the prosecution
of pension claims will sincerely regret to
hear of his death.
