was admitted to this Mulberry St.
U.S. Hospital, in Harrisburg, Pa. of which E Cowles. 1st Surg U.S.A.
is Surgeon, and Mr Hyndshaw Chaplain, on the 27th of
day of July 1863. He was at the battle of
Gettysburg on the 1st day of July 1863, and was wound
on the first day of July 1863. His right arm
was amputated 2 inches above the elbow 48 hours
after he was wounded. He is now doing
splendidly. Good health. healthy stump &c.
P.S. Sgt Strickland now has a free communication open between
himself and family.
