Sergt Francis Strickland Co. I, 154th N. York Regt
was admitted to this Mulberry St.
Hosptal, in ~~Harrisburg~~ Pa. of which E. Cowles. Alst Surg. U.S.A.
is Surgeon, and Mr Wyndshaw Chaplain, on the 24th of
July 1863. He was at the battle of
Gettysburg on the 1st day of July 1863, and was wounded
on the first day of July 1863. His right arm
was amputated 2 inches above the elbow, 48 hours
after he was wounded. He is now doing
splendidly. Good health. healthy stump &c.
P.S. Sergt Strickland now has a free communication open between
himself and family.
