# Franklinville Doctor Was Surgeon-In-Chief

Franklinville paper is quoted

FRANKLINVILLE - The Hon. Dr. Henry Van Aernam died Friday, June 1, 1894.

Probably the largest funeral ever held in Franklinville was that of the Hon. Henry Van Aernam, which occurred Monday aft-

Services were held in the large First Presbyterian Church which was filled with a large concourse of people, among them many prominent ones from out of town.

Many old veterans attended the funeral in their uniforms and carried their guns, colors, etc. Two Sons of Veterans marched ahead of the casket and two in the rear, each couple carrying floral tributes which were beautiful and appropriate.

The bearers were A. P. Adams. Dr. H. Walker, William Ely, Dr. R. Terry, William Swinton and Dexter C. Weed, all old and warm friends of the deceased.

As a mark of respect all the business places were closed up as was the First room of the District School. Ten Broeck Academy, of which Dr. Van Aernam was one of the honored trustees, was kept closed all day.

On the 5th of October, 1862, he was assigned to duty as surgeonin-chief of the Second Brigade, Second Division, of the Eleventh Army Corps, and on the 28th day of December, 1863, surgeon-in-chief of the Division, and in April of the following year surgeonchief of the Second Brigade, Second Division of the Twentieth Army Corps.
