I ask this favor feeling assured that my services will be very little needed here, while remaining in camp, until the arrival of the conscripts, with our Regiment reduced as it is now, since the late battle in which we were engaged to 128 officers & men <u>present</u> — and two Medical Officers remaining in camp with the Regiment.
