
MANUAL OF BAYONET EXERCISE, 1852 BY BVT. CAPT. GEORGE B. McCLELLAN USED BY CAPT. LEWIS D. WARNER Co. C, 154th REGT., N.Y.S. VOL. INF.

LEWIS D. WARNER was born in 1822 and was bound out as an apprentice in the tanning business until age 21. On the termination of his apprenticeship he received a suit of clothes, a pair of boots and six dollars in cash. In 1845 he returned to Portville and made annual raft trips down the Allegheny River. After 1854 he was a carpenter and joiner in addition to rafting on the river. He enrolled, August 19, 1862, at Jamestown, to serve three years; mustered in as captain, Co. C, September 26, 1862; as major, June 30, 1863; as lieutenant colonel, January 19, 1865; promoted colonel, March 24, 1865; mustered out with regiment, June 11, 1865, near Bladensburg, Md. He returned home to follow his trade. For six years he was clerk in an office and in the county clerk's office for one and a half years. Colonel Warner was Portville's supervisor for ten terms and justice of the peace for twenty years.
