### Only One Civil War Vet Remains in Villenova Township

SOUTH DAYTON—Franklin D. Weaver, 92 years old last January 14, is the only remaining veteran of the Civil War in the town of Villenova, four miles from here. Mr. Weaver has been in excellent health until a month ago, when he was confined to his bed for a large portion of the time.

Born in Michigan, he has spent most of his life in New York state, around Perrysburg and for the past 12 years near Hamlet.

He joined the Co. F 154 N. Y. Volunteers and saw service in 1862 and until the latter part of 1863, appearing in many of the decisive engagement of the Civil War.

His wife, Jennie Weaver, died in 1914. There are two children, Elton Weaver and Ida W. Marvin, both of whom reside in the town of Villenova.
