1534. The upper portion of the right femur, obliquely fractured in the upper third and bruised at the base of the great b. 16L trochanter. There is a fringe of spongy callus without union. The specimen bears the mark of much suppuration and it appears as though some of the new bone had been lost.

Private O. F. W., "G," 154th New York, 25: Chancellorsville, 3d May; treated in Acquia Creek Hospital until sent to Washington, 14th June; died from exhaustion, 31st July, 1863.
