In reference to Andrew Part's capture, and his incarceration in a Confederate prison, there are few known facts. My father told me that Andrew was made a cook. That insured him as good food as was available. Another aspect appeared in his reports of punishment of prisoners. Andrew said that the guards would punish a man by fastening a rope around each of his thumbs then hoist him off the ground and tie the ropes together. A soldier would be left hanging all day with his feet in the air. That threat would deter the bravest of the brave. If physical punishment had been experienced by A. J. he would have said so.
