to administer oaths Andrew G. Park aged fifty two years, a resident of

Wesley in the County of Cattaraugus and State of

New York well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit and

who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

[Note.—Affiants should state how they gain a knowledge of the facts to which they testify.]

That on the 3rd day of September, 1883, that I was riding in a single carriage with one Beltek Hall, the horse became exceedingly frightened, I raised up to jump out, at that moment the horse made a fearful jump forward, which threw me from the carriage, landing me about ten or twelve feet from the carriage on a pile of broken stone, throwing my whole weight upon my left hand, which I threw out to save myself.

This bent my hand clear over backward which either broke or dislocated every bone in my wrist, back & hand. My hand remained in a swollen condition for over two years and now is weak, deformed and almost useless.

Each disability must be rated separately, the act of Congress of March 2, 1895, requiring that the report of such examining surgeons shall specifically state the rating which, in their judgment, the applicant is entitled to.

There is evidence of a severe injury of left hand caused by a fall the carpus and metacarpus are much deformed the carpo metacarpal articulation was thrown backward, there is a marked prominence on dorsal surface, and motion of the fingers and wrist limited 1/2

Circumference r. hand 9 in.
Circumference left wrist 6 1/2
Circumference r. wrist 7 in.
Circumference left forearm 10 in.
Circumference r. forearm 11 in showing considerable atrophy on left side, this probably was a dislocation never properly reduced.

There is slight deafness of left ear but can hear ordinary conversation at six ft with either ear. r. ear normal. No rating.

duly sworn, did state in reference to the claim of Andrew G. Park for
pension Claim No. *Cert. 805063*, late sergeant Co. "B" 154th N. Y.
State Volunteer Infantry, as follows;

I have read the annexed certificate of James E. Bixby, notary
public, made at this time in my presence and at my request. The
first record therein referred to was contained in a bible which I
have this day obtained from my sister, Betsey Eleanor Cole; the
second record therein referred to is contained in what was my father's
family bible which has ~~szz~~ been in my possession since my return
from the war in 1866 and which was then given to me by my sister;
that my father's name was Sidney Park and that he died April 17,
1864; that I am familiar with his handwriting and know that the
entries quoted in the annexed certificate are in his handwriting;
that my given name in childhood was George Andrew Park and I was then
commonly called by the middle name, "Andrew" and that on reaching
maturity I wrote my name Andrew G. Park instead of G. Andrew Park
and have so written it and have been so known ever since; that I am
the same person named in said discharge as Andrew J. Park and such
discharge has been in my possession ever since its date; that shortly
after my discharge I discovered the error in the initial "J." and
procured the records to be corrected.
