Lookout valley Ten Febuary 8th 1864

My Dear Rhoda I again attempt to write a few lins to you it is now more then two weaks since i have heard from you I would like to know what is the matter with you hat you will neather write or send me what I want some month ago I sent for your likness you said that you would send it but you had better have said you would not then I sent for stamps you sent anought to pay what I had borrowed and 3 leaf and now if you ever get this you will have to pay for it I sent I sent for writing paper you sent two sheats I think which would have dun for four letters of your stile but dont go so far with me mo where is the last sheat i have and dirty amought at that and there air none here for sail now at any proce but I think that I can manage to get some thing to write on next time you ware very anchious but I should get forlow and but there is mo use your expecting me home as the first 2 that # applyed have got mone yet and no other os the Company can get a furlow tell the do and get back without they can give a better reason why and I cammot say that you would be any better of for my comeing home and i think that you would be rather worth of if it would sost me about 40 dollers Leut L W Beardsly hath just got back from home he is the only man of the Redgt who hath got a furlow Rhody since I comenced to write the mail came in with a letter from you and the tribune that Westfield pater and hymn book hath not come prahaps they may come next mail it is stringht that you can not get a liknes things must change a great deail since I leaft home I wroate to Leut T G Quaye severall weaks ago but recieved no annsor yet
