WILLIAM HOYT REYNOLDS 1837 - 1907

"Active Career Closed by Death.

William Hoyt Reynolds Joined the Great Majority Saturday.

In Varied Fields of Labor

He Rendered Up Cheerful Service without Complaint -- A Lifelong Resident of This County Laid to Rest.

Another aged and highly esteemed resident of this vicinity laid to rest on Saturday morning when death came to claim William Hoyt Reynolds at his home in E. Randolph. He had been sick since October last but a stroke of paralysis six days before his death hastened the final dissolution.

Mr. Reynolds was 70 years, five months and seven days old and had been very active in the town of Allegany and had been a resident of this county practically all his life. He owned a farm of 150 acres on the Big Red House where he lived for many years and was reckoned among the substantial and leading citizens of the Town of Red House. During the oil excitement, Mr. Reynolds spent some time in the oil country and was a busy participant in the activities of that region. About seven years ago he moved to E. Randolph and since that time had been engaged in the lightning rod business, having wired many buildings in this vicinity.

Mr. Reynolds was married in Humphrey 51 years ago on January 1st. and is survived by his wife and the following children: William S. Reynolds, Washington, Pa.; John C. Reynolds, Ernest H. Reynolds, Randolph; Mrs. Ida R. Wells, Fayetteville, Ark.; Mrs. Blanche Brady, Stillwater, Minn.; Mrs. S. V. Kenton, Missoula, Mont.

Throughout his active career he embraced many forms of industry and business. Mr. Reynolds never neglected his social duties and his courteous and pleasant demeanor won for him a wide circle of friends as falls to the general lot.

The funeral was held at 2 P.M. Monday. Prayer in the late home was followed by a service in the E. Randolph M.E. Church, conducted by the Pastor. Among those attending were the 3 sons of the deceased, Mrs. James Warren, Verona, Pa.; Parley Reynolds of Ellicottville, a half-brother; Perry Reynolds and family of Salamanca; Dr. Reynolds, Buffalo; Mrs. Mary Ewen, Little Valley; Irving Reynolds, Corwango; Mr. and Mrs. Charles Worden, Olean.

Burial was made in the E. Randolph Cemetery.
