Bradford Rowland was born in the town of Great Valley, May 1st, 1844. He enlisted in Co. G. of the 154th N. Y. V. in 1862 and served through the war, participating in the battles at Chancellorsville, Gettysburg and Missionary Ridge, afterwards he was detailed to court headquarters. He was taken prisoner at Gettysburg.

After the war Mr. Rowland was married to Sarah A. Scott on March 4, 1866, to this union one daughter Jennie May was born May 22, 1872, and died, Oct. 19, 1892.

Mr. Rowland passed away at his home in Ellicottville Sunday, November 5th. The funeral was held on Wednesday conducted by the Knights Templars of Salamanca and Ellicottville Lodge No. 807 F. & A. M. assisted by the Rev. Herman.
