- F16 - Attractive officer's saddle valise in good condition. Nice embossed designs all over and nice ling. This has 3 straps for closing which are torn but it would display very well. These were used by most officers for carrying personal belongings. Great for display w/an officer's saddle.....\$67.50
- F17 - CW crupper in extremely nice condition. Complete. A nice easy to display piece of regulation CW horse equipment.....\$7.50
- F18 - CW carbine socket, used to support the carbine in the saddle. Perfect condition.....\$2.50
- F19 - Pair of brass officer's style spurs complete w/usable straps. I think the straps are later replacements but they look real nice. The spurs are in perfect condition.....\$37.50
- F20 - Pair of fancy officer's spurs, complete and in very good condition. Deeply ribbed side straps and deep designs below the rowels. Really a nice pair of CW spurs.....\$59.50
- F21 - Pair of silver plated officer's spurs w/their original straps. Flat side straps, small iron rowels. Fine condition and interesting. An attractive set of period spurs.....\$37.50
- F22 - Standard CW picket pin in good sound condition but a relic found at Fredericksburg. Could be cleaned much better and fine for display.....\$21.50
- F23 - Farrier's buttress, very unusual looking tool and one still used today. Has large wooden handle w/chisel on the opposite end, shaped similar to a brace and bit. Used by the farrier for trimming the horse's hoof. Marked very deeply into the chisel part w/a military US. A really fine and rare CW cavalry accessory.....\$37.50

MEDALS AND INSIGNIA

- G01 - CW dog tag just like the one on the right of page 134 in Lord's. Perfect condition. Stamped on the reverse, "Jos La Flour Co. D 5th Reg. Vt. Vols. Elmore." Fine.....\$97.50
- G02 - As above, only stamped "D.C. Richardson Co. C. 14th Reg. N.H.V. Marlboro." Also very good.....\$97.50
- G03 - As above but stamped "2nd Sergt. R. Powers Bat. L 11th R. . Vt. Vols. St. Albans." Very good condition but has extra chain hole in center.....\$97.50
- G04 - As above, marked "S.H. Goodalf Co. G 6th Vt. Vols. Godbury." Very good condition.....\$97.50
- G05 - Another ID disc but w/Lincoln bust and "Abraham Lincoln Pres. War of 1861" on the face and stamped on the reverse "S.R. Hartman Co. H. 93rd Pa. Vols. Battles Fair Oaks 7 Ds before Richmond 2nd Bull Run" Very fine.....\$117.50
- G06 - As above, only "Edgar S. Hannon Co. B. 154th N.Y. Vols. Cartabarrugus N.Y." Very Fine.....\$117.50
- G07 - As above only "Wm K. Hastings Co. H 62nd P.V. enlisted Aug 25 1862. Fine condition.....\$97.50
- G08 - A pair of ID discs from the same man. Both are the type on the right, page 143 in Lord's. One is stamped "1st Sergt Chas. Courtland Co. I 15th Reg N.H.V. Rochester," the other "1st Sergt C. Courtland Co. I 15th Reg N.H.V. Rochester." The first disc is well worn and the second is like new. First set like this I've seen.....\$217.50
- G09 - Another single disc but this one is like the one on the left on page 143 in Lord's. Marked "William Ward Co. G 2nd Vet. Cav. N.Y.S.V. Steuben Co. N.Y. Age 19 years.".....\$97.50
- G10 - Silver shield shaped ID pin. Finely engraved border, War of 1861 impressed in the bottom. Face nicely engraved "J. Chapman Co. G 2nd Regt Wis. v. Iron Brigade. Extremely desirable style and unit.....\$189.50
- G11 - 2 piece solid silver 5th corps ID badge. Really as nice as they come. Back engraved "1861 Edwin B. Taft 1864," front "2nd Brigade," and the bar "Co. E 26 Mass Vols." All in beautiful script and completely original.....\$147.50
- G12 - Very nice stamped silver shield w/impressed eagle on flag above and engraved below "Geo. W. Reynor Co. A 139 Pa. Vol." Near perfect condition. \$179.50
- G13 - Unusual nickled brass shield w/suspension pin and t-bar. Engraved on the face "1861 - 1863 4th R.I.V.V.A. and on the back D.R. Rose Blakely Hill." Complete w/his discharge and photostats of his records. He was wounded and a prisoner of war. Unusual type and the first I've seen.....\$97.50
- G14 - Small silver star corps badge w/28 cut out of the center. T-bar pinback. The 28th Pennsylvania was part of the 20th corps. A fine and unusual corps
